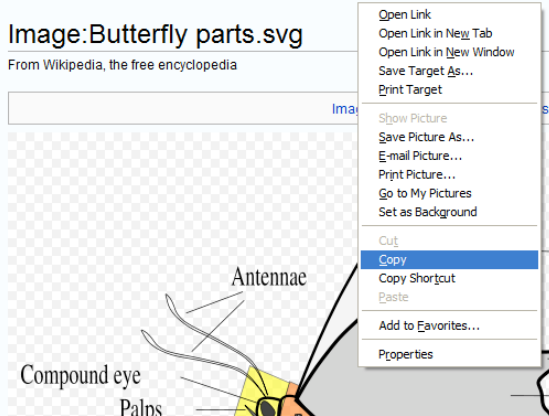


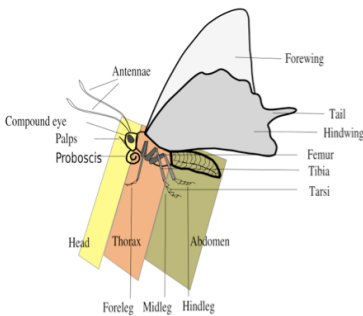
## Using Images and Building Graphic Organizers

### • 1 Exercise: Using an image on your slide

- 1.1 To transfer an image from the internet to your presentation, right-click on an image to copy, then paste onto your presentation slide. See Fig. 1 below.



- 1.2 Try to transfer this example image from Wikipedia, shown in fig. 2 below. The butterfly article is at: <http://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Butterfly>



### • 2 Exercise: How to construct a graphic organizer: Life cycle of the butterfly

- 2.1 Copy and paste the 4 life cycle stages onto your slide as in exercise 1 above. The butterfly life cycle page is at: [http://www.ansp.org/museum/butterflies/life\\_cycle.php](http://www.ansp.org/museum/butterflies/life_cycle.php). If you google for "stages butterfly", this link to the national academy of natural sciences is at the top of the list.
- 2.2 You can resize the pictures on your slide by grabbing one of the corner "handles" and dragging (as in Fig. 3 below). If you're the "pixel perfect" type that needs each picture to be exactly the same height, you can double click each picture and set the height in inches.



- 2.3 In PowerPoint 2003, add block arrows using the "Autoshapes" button on the bottom-left of the window, as shown in Fig. 4 below.
